

President's Report

Over the past couple of weeks, I've been considering what he wrote.

The Board and many volunteer committee members have been working selflessly on school drive preparations, our upcoming budget, strategic plans, education and policy matters, and various initiatives, all towards a common goal.

At our last Board meeting in early March, we welcomed the Honorable MLA, Nathan IP.

Mr. IP is the MLA for Edmonton-South West, and serves as the Official Opposition Critic for Jobs, Economy, and Trade. Prior to being an MLA, Mr. IP served nearly a decade as an Edmonton public school trustee. While we discussed funding, teacher recruitment challenges, and school choice, most of our conversation focused on the covenantal blessings at PICS. We spoke of our commitment to supporting all students, each uniquely made in God's image, including those who require extra support. We highlighted the close connection between home, church, and school, and the support we receive from the school society. We celebrated the school's academic success, but emphasized the school theme "I Belong" as true achievement lies in fostering community where everyone knows they belong to God and to one another.

Mr. Ip praised our staff and students, recalling his previous visits to our school. He was particularly impressed by the society's efforts to serve the broader community. We shared an example of Safe Families and how many in our community are supporting this organization, both directly and indirectly.

On March 18th, I had the privilege of attending PICS for the day on an official board visit. I was able to visit classrooms and experience everything from Chemistry to Kindergarten. A separate report could be written (and is!) about how inspired I was by our staff and students. Yes, there were student antics—some escalating into discipline issues that day. Thank a teacher next time you see them, it's a tough job. Proverbs 22:6 instructs us to train our children the way they should go. Teachers are not just filling minds; they are working to change hearts and encourage souls. This is a tough, sacred calling. Sometimes that's enforcing a rule to redirect a struggling child, and sometimes it's carving out precious time to play floor hockey and collapsing on the staff room couch, exhausted but joyful. As sometimes is the case, we speak up to raise concerns but often are silent to encourage. I encourage you to lift up our staff. Send them an email, thank them in person, and let them know how much you value their hard work and sacrifice.

In my short time on the Board, I've sensed a collective body of students, staff, volunteers, and society members working toward the same goal, using their various God-given gifts to the best of their ability, not just for themselves, but for the good of all. When you and your children are part of PICS, you join a community of individuals serving each other in order that God may be glorified through Jesus Christ. What a beautiful thing to be part of and support.
